

Forgiveness After Solidarity

The 20th century's largest social movement, Solidarność mobilized 10 million Polish workers under the sign of the cross. Michał Łuczewski, a sociology professor at the University of Warsaw, explores its theological roots and what parts of the promise of Solidarity still need to be realized today. His talk will be accompanied by the presentation of his new book, *Solidarity Step by Step*, and a screening of his 30-minute documentary, *The Father, the Son & the Friend: Forgiveness After Solidarity*.
