Thanks to all who responded to our recent survey. Your suggestions have inspired some upcoming programming events. That includes instruction in **NVivo**, the qualitative software program for analyzing text, image, video, and web-based data. We're planning an online workshop that will be led by a professional instructor who will introduce the benefits of this sophisticated and flexible tool of analysis, followed later by more applied guidance in using it. Our FSC computer lab offers access to NVivo, as well as Atlas.ti, SPSS, Stata, Arc GIS Pro, TExtract, and LIWC software.

Responding to a majority of survey participants, we're also developing plans to bring **publishing and publicity-related coaching** to faculty, including how to effectively promote your research, community-engaged, or other scholarly work. Also on the docket is a panel that will focus on **working with students**.

Finally, join us for this year's last 3 sessions of **Turning the Page**, our online faculty writing group. We will meet **December 2, 9, and 16** before we close the book on 2022. We'll pick up the pen again on **Friday, January 6**, for another quarter of informal writing and sharing every **Friday** from **9-11am**. Just click the **Zoom link** to join.
