The window closes at the end of the day on **Saturday, October 15**, to apply for <u>internal grants</u> from De Paul Council programs for support from:

Applications for **Undergraduate Research**Assistant Program grants may be submitted through **October 31**. Full-time tenure line and term faculty are invited to apply for up to 75 hours per quarter of **student help** on a scholarly project to be conducted next Winter or Spring Quarter. The faculty member and student apply together. You may request up to 3 quarters of assistance at once, but first-time or untenured faculty applicants get special consideration. Proposals to the **Academic Growth and Innovation Fund** are due on **December 10** for projects starting mid-February 2023. All full-time DPU faculty and staff may request funding of 1 to 3 years for a proposed new or existing academic program, co-curricular project, or other innovation designed to enhance university revenue, including conceptual data collection.
