CERTIFICATE IN TEACHING ENGLISH IN TWO-YEAR COLLEGES

The English Department's *Certificate in Teaching English in Two-Year Colleges* is designed to prepare prospective teachers of introductory classes in English, writing, and the humanities in community college settings.

Participants will learn to teach critical and analytical reading, the processes and disciplines of writing, and at least one additional aspect of the arts, humanities, or communication curriculum in two-year colleges. The Certificate program includes a teaching internship in a two-year college.

Admission.

Before submitting any materials, applicants should first contact the Certificate Program Director, Dr. Carolyn Goffman, to learn if this program fits your needs. See below for contact information.

To be admitted to the Certificate program, students must have completed or currently be working towards a Master's degree in English, Writing, or a related field. Applicants must also submit to the director of the Certificate program: a cover letter, a current CV, undergraduate and graduate academic transcripts, a sample of recent critical or professional writing, the names of two faculty references, and a letter of application that describes the student's particular interests in teaching in two-year colleges.

Certificate Requirements.

The certificate requires 16 hours of graduate credit: three graduate-level courses in English and an internship in teaching in a two-year college.

- ENG 509, Internship at a two-year college, arranged by Certificate Director
- One additional course from list below, approved by Certificate Director:

 - WRD 582 Writing Center Theory and Pedagogy
