Amate House

Amate House is a young adult volunteer program for the Archdiocese of Chicago. They are dedicated to providing young adults with opportunities for personal, professional, and spiritual growth. Each year, 30+ college graduates devote a year to serving in Chicago as Amate House volunteers. These young adults live in community houses in the neighborhoods where they serve, spend 40+ hours a week performing critical tasks at financially strapped nonprofits, parishes and schools in the city, and participate in a formation program that encourages them to understand and explore the link between Christian faith and service.

UCTC volunteers are full-time regular classroom teachers during the academic year and take classes during the summers and, at times, during the fall and spring.
