A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

Dear Friends,

Chaddick Institute's efforts to cultivate student involvement and public engagement are the product of our team's commitment to expanding its urban-focused mission and the generosity of benefactors who share this goal. Chaddick's study trips, scholarships, and urban and environmental programs are supported by Assistant Director William Kling, graduate assistants, program advisors, and the School of Public Service faculty and staff. Their work draws upon financial and in-kind contributions from those who share to

promote effective policies for—and appreciation of—cities, neighborhoods, suburbs, and transportation systems.

This synergy made 2023 and early 2024 remarkable times for our programs, scholarships, and research activities. In many ways, though, the travel opportunities we offered graduate students stood out. Chaddick sponsored seven trips to places outside the Chicago region for students over the past 12 months--more than any other year in our history. Our autumn trip to Milwaukee study (attended by 22 students) and Texas's Move America conference (attended by seven) generated enormous camaraderie. So did our more recent trip to the Transportation Research Board conference in Washington, DC, which evoked memories of my first trip there as a graduate student years ago. Last May, 12 students joined Professor Nick Kachiroubas for a policy-focused immersion in Springfield, IL.

Three other travel opportunities strengthened our ties to organizations sharing our mission. Last May, six students went overnight to learn about waterway policy at the National Great River Research &

Education Center's Confluence Center in Alton, IL. Graduate student Janson Busby won a bestpaper award at the Rural Transportation Assistance Program conference in South Carolina. At the same time, Mayra Shuja attended a leadership summit in Boston, which augmented her internship at the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning.

These learning experiences are, above all else, made possible by the Chaddick Foundation's financial support while also being supported by generous gifts from Susan Aaron, the Donnelley



Foundation, Steve Rudolph, and others. Their support reinforces our belief that cultivating student learning is much more than classes and course assignments. It is about encouraging students to be curious, cooperative, and comfortable in new environments. This philosophy also manifests in William Kling's expanding work in internship placements at DePaul and our efforts to allow students to conduct research and become co-authors of our publications.

Our 2023 Chaddick Annual Report shows that last year was filled with timely events, student engagement, and pleasant surprises. This momentum has made this year exciting for our team.

NATIONAL GREAT RIVERS RESEARCH & EDUCATION CENTER INITIATIVE

Chaddick began with the third phase of our river ecology project with the National Great Rivers Research & Education Center, a prominent nonprofit organization based in Alton, IL. William Kling, JD, leads the project with assistance from Emily Hamilton. Advising also came from Friends of Chicago River and the Corn Belts Port. Among the highlights of 2023 were:

• Comprehensively evaluating cultural and environmental initiatives throughout riverfront municipalities in Illinois through spatial and qualitative research.



- Traveling to central and western Illinois to meet riverfront leaders.
- Participating in the City of Chicago's River Ecology Task Force.
- Traveling to Alton to connect with researchers and leaders at the National Great Rivers Research & Education Center
- We are commencing work on a large-scale outreach project that will bring together leading stakeholders who shape policy regarding rivers throughout the state.

Chaddick Institute's Spring Study Trip MAY 2023 | ATTENDANCE: 18



The Chaddick Institute maintains an active program in aviation policy.


Programmatic Highlights

OUR ACADEMIC JOURNAL: ISSUES IN AVIATION LAW AND POLICY

We published two issues of "*IALP*" in 2023, one in May and another in November. The journal, managed by Stephen Rudolph, covers legal and policy issues affecting civil aviation, matters related to commercial airports, and other aspects of aviation.

AMAZON AIR POLICY BRIEFS

The Chaddick Institute continued releasing an annual brief on Amazon Air, a unit of Amazon whose growth has significant implications for at-home delivery services. Each brief explored the airline's domestic and international initiatives. We thank our graduate student study team of Akshara Das, Emily Hamilton, Carrie Craig, and Blythe Chesney, as well as Stephen Rudolph and Toni Jahn, for assisting with these publications.



Our Amazon Air Briefs garnered international attention, including coverage in prominent trade journals.

Since June 2020, more than 40 news articles devoted exclusively to the first brief have been published.
