Stephen Prothero is one of the foremost American public intellectuals engaging the subject of interfaith relations. He is a professor in the Department of Religion at Boston University and the author of *The American Bible: How Our Words Unite, Divide, And Define A Nation*, *God Is Not One: The Eight Rival Religions That Run The World—And Why Their Differences Matter*, and the New York Times bestseller *Religious Literacy: What Americans Need To Know*. A regular contributor to the Wall Street Journal, Prothero has also written for the New York Times, Slate, Salon, the Washington Post, the Los Angeles Times, the Boston Globe and has appeared on the Daily Show and the Colbert Report. In 2010 he was invited to speak about religious literacy at the White House. Prothero received his B.A. from Yale in American studies and his Ph.D. in the study of religion from Harvard.
