## A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

Dear Chaddick Friends,

With many Chicago neighborhoods and inner-ring suburbs grappling with chronic unemployment and diminished public confidence in government institutions, the importance of our work at the Chaddick Institute for Metropolitan Development came into sharp focus in 2016. In fact, I don't recall a time in my tenure as director of the Institute in which our work has been as critical as it has been over this past year. We launched a journal in cooperation with the Illinois Municipal League to better inform policy decision-making, supported planning efforts for several alderman's offices and regional agencies, and undertook student-supported research that has established our Institute as a prominent voice on the "sharing economy".


We were fortunate throughout 2016 to have significant in-house graphic design talent, first with Marisa Schulz and followed by Rachael Smith. Their work is highlighted in our new exhibit at Chicago Union Station, entitled "Windy City in Motion: Movies + Travel in Chicago", which Rachael designed, and the "visual refurbishing" of our office reception area to showcase our urban mission.

The entire staff worked overtime to complete the inaugural issue of the *Illinois Municipal Policy Journal*, our new peer-review publication coedited by professor Nick Kachiroubas, my colleague in the School of Public Service, with extensive support from Dana Yanocha. The "IMPJ" features articles on timely municipal policy issues written by scholars from DePaul, John Marshall University, University of Illinois-Chicago, Northern Illinois University, and Illinois Institute of Technology, among others.

Notable "firsts" from 2016 include a Leadership Award in honor of Camille Hatzenbuehler bestowed upon three emerging leaders in the School of Public Service, and a Templeton Foundation grant in support of student-oriented programming focused on urban innovation. We also lifted a glass at "Pub Night" to promote fellowship among students, alumni, and faculty, and continued our longstanding educational partnerships with the American Planning Association and Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning. Our cross-college collaborations with the DePaul Real Estate Center and International Aviation Law Institute, both of which involve widely-attended annual symposia, also continue to blossom.

Perhaps most importantly, the Chaddick Institute offered more than 100 graduate students valuable experiences through professional engagement, research involvement, and stimulating travel opportunities over the past year – all of which was made possible due to generous financial support from the Chaddick Foundation, in-kind support from DePaul University's College of Liberal Arts & Social Sciences, and many other benefactors.

In 2017, we will continue to build on our legacy of strong research, meaningful professional and student engagement, and constant curiosity about metropolitan development issues.

## RESEARCH & CREATIVE ACTIVITY

*Our Institute brings attention to timely policy issues that are important to improving the performance of metropolitan regions. Each year, our research team issues three or four major studies, all of which are the product of extensive graduate student involvement. Several of our studies over the past year received national attention, as noted in the “Chaddick in the News” section that follows. Another way we have brought urban planning and transportation issues to the attention of a wide variety of people is through our exhibit at Chicago’s Union Station. This multimedia exhibit explores Chicago’s history as a transportation hub through the lens of movies and photographs that feature our trains, planes and stations. The exhibit was curated by DePaul graduate student and Chaddick staffer Rachael Smith and has been on display in the great hall since August 2016.*

#### **ASHEVILLE, NC. CONFERENCE & STUDY TRIP | OCTOBER 2016 | ATTENDANCE: 4**


Four graduate students joined Professor Schwieterman to present Chaddick's research at the National Conference on Rural Public and Intercity Bus Transportation.

These events and workshops are part of our mission to be a “clearinghouse” for professionals, as well as to give graduate students access to meaningful networking events.

## ACADEMIC SYMPOSIA, NATIONAL WEBINARS & POLICY PARTNERSHIPS

Chaddick hosts two major symposia each year, one on aviation policy with DePaul's Law School, and another half-day annual conference with the DePaul Real Estate Center, which is housed in the Driehaus College of Business. Both showcase the benefits of cross-college collaboration and interdisciplinary analysis. Our institute also hosts national webinars for the Transportation Research Forum and is making plans for TRF's annual conference in Chicago this spring.

In 2016, Chaddick launched a major new project with the Illinois Municipal League—the creation of the Illinois Municipal Policy Journal. This annual publication features research relevant to municipal leaders and policy advocates on a wide spectrum of issues including economics, politics, management, and finance. 



