Technical Guidelines

Materials are accepted for publication in electronic word-processing format. MS Word is preferred, although certain others are accepted. The journal is published in black & white; thus, care should be taken to assure that color photos, charts, and graphics will be legible and of sufficient contrast in black & white. Such materials should be submitted in .tif, .jif, or .jpg format. All submissions should be sent via email to IALP@depaul.edu and directed to the attention of Stephen B. Rudolph, Managing Editor.

Footnotes, endnotes, and appendices are acceptable. However, endnotes will be reformatted into footnotes at the bottom of the appropriate text pages.

Content Guidelines

The suggested minimum length for an article is 5,000 words. Submissions of up to 8,500 words are encouraged. Footnotes are not included in the above word counts. Please contact the Managing Editor for details.

Permission to use materials protected by copyright must be obtained by the author prior to publication. Copies of all such permissions must be provided to the Institute upon request.

Materials reflecting official government positions will be published as submitted and will not be altered or edited by the Institute, its faculty reviewers, or its Editorial Board without permission. Submissions containing such materials should so specify.

IALP is published in the American English language. In order to assure accuracy, materials submitted in languages other than English must be accompanied by an English translation approved by the author.

All citations must conform to the 18th, 19th, or 20th edition of *The Bluebook: A Uniform System of Citation*.
