

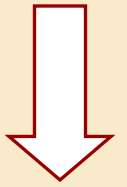

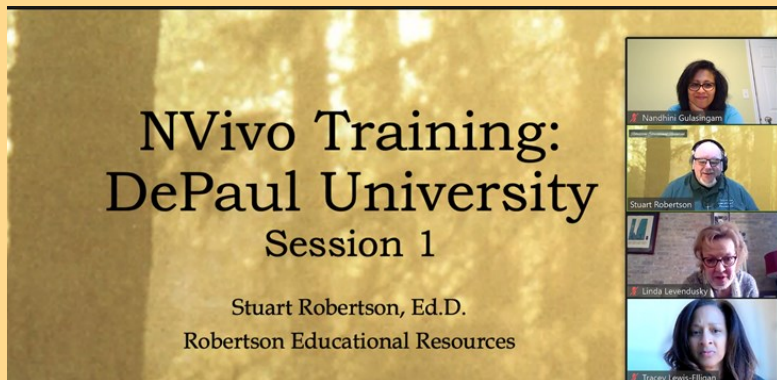

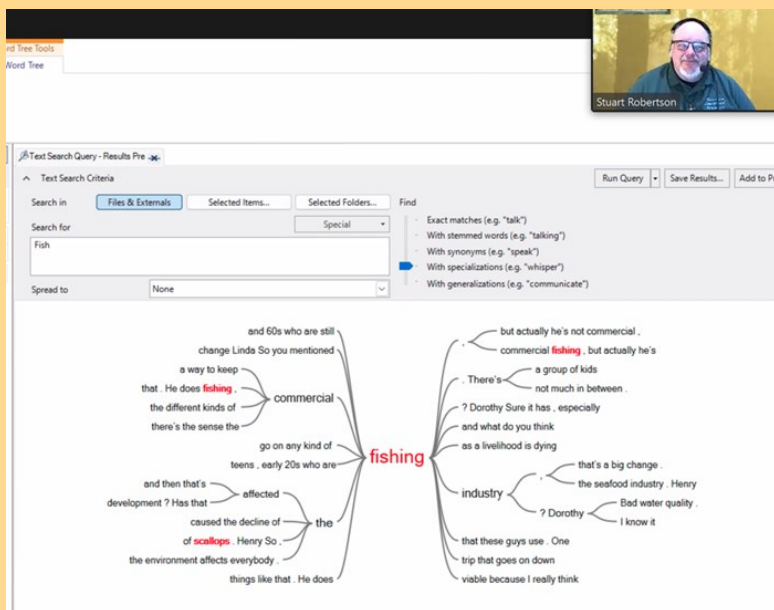


Noses to the grindstone, the Faculty Scholarship Collaborative has been burrowing in, assembling resources and exploring opportunities to help fortify your scholarship agendas this season. See what we've gathered.



Many thanks to all who joined us for the clear, user-friendly introduction to **NVivo** at Session I of the two-part training we're hosting this month. We're looking forward to **Session II** on **Friday, February 24, from noon-1:30pm**, when we'll learn more about the capabilities of this data management and analysis tool. At this session participants have been invited to describe their particular data needs or bring their NVivo wish-lists to get an experienced pro's advice on available options. But you don't need to have a project to take part. Everyone who registered for Session I will automatically receive the new Zoom link to return.

All LAS faculty have access to **NVivo 12** either **remotely or onsite** through our computer lab in the 990 West Fullerton building. There we also have Atlas.ti, SPSS, Stata, and LIWC qualitative data analysis software. Contact us to learn more. If while doing your data analyses—whether using NVivo or a different platform—you run up against a statistical or research problem beyond your reach, we have another source to suggest. **The Analysis Factor** is a consulting group of experts in statistics, statistical software, data analysis, and data visualization who can provide one-on-one guidance to help steer you through the muddle. PRINCETON U. PRESS

Princeton University Press is accepting applications through **February 22** for its [Supporting Diverse Voices Book Proposal Development Grants](#) from Black, Indigenous, or People of Color with prospective projects in anthropology, economics, politics/international relations, sociology, or urban studies. Recipients receive financial support to work with a coach to develop a book proposal in exchange for first consideration for publishing by PUP. VINCENTIAN ENDOWMENT FUND

Applicants have until **March 3** to submit a proposal for the annual [Principal Vincentian Endowment Fund Grants](#) program for projects exemplifying DePaul's mission and core values. All DPU faculty, staff, and students are eligible. The broad scope includes research, curriculum development, pilot or community service projects, and conferences or events. Support typically ranges from \$2,000 to \$5,000. [Apply](#) here.

HUMANITIESX FELLOWS

Democracy and Rights is the theme for the 2023-24 [HumanitiesX Fellows](#) program which is accepting applications through **March 6**. Over the academic year, two full-time LAS Faculty Fellows collaborate with a Community Fellow partner to co-design a Spring Quarter interdisciplinary, project-based course in the humanities around the chosen theme. Faculty receive a three-course reduction and a summer stipend. Teams are encouraged to contact Faculty Director [Lisa Dush](#) before applying.

UCCRI

Grants of up to \$25,000 are being offered by the [Urban Collaborative Community Research Initiative](#) for interdisciplinary, community-engaged research projects of up to one year, with perhaps longer potential, co-designed with community or external partners to address challenges to cities and including research opportunities for LAS students. Apply from **March 3-31**.

CIVICS INITIATIVE SUMMER INSTITUTE

Full-time term and tenure-line faculty are invited to apply for the **DePaul Civics Initiative Summer Institute** that will be held two days on campus, probably in mid-July. Participants receive a stipend of \$1,700 which includes participation in two half-day, follow-up sessions. They will develop their own sections of an interdisciplinary curriculum that is exploring new ways to stimulate engagement with current issues facing democracy. The application period opens **March 2** when details will become available on the [Institute's website](#).

EXTERNAL FUNDING

The **National Science Foundation** is accepting proposals for its [Mid-Career Advancement](#) awards until **March 1** and for [Faculty Early Career Development Program \(CAREER\)](#) grants until **July 27**.
